The Administration has not appointed a Global AIDS Coordinator. It remains to be seen whether and how quickly the administration will act to reverse harmful global AIDS policies.

ADDRESS D.C.AFFORDABLE HOUSING CRISIS

The Washington, DC government has determined that there is enough housing stock to house poor people in D.C. who need affordable housing and has developed strategies to increase outreach to people on housing waiting lists. However, there are no resources to get people into housing and DC has no strategy to address this lack of resources.
